



Information for Prospective Trainers

Family Worker Training + Development Programme (FWT+DP) is a non-government, not for profit agency supporting the learning and development of people working with families in Western Sydney. FWT+DP deliver a wide range of dynamic, affordable training and other learning and development opportunities. Topics and issues covered relate to the work of individuals and agencies working with families. FWT+DP prides itself on delivering quality practice based training and development opportunities based on principles of best practice and the current evidence base relating to work with children and families.

Training is offered to those working directly with families and the service systems working with families with children up to 18 years.

FWT+DP has established an eligibility list of trainers who would like to be considered for current and/or future work at our organisation. FWT+DP will draw trainers from this list when developing its 6 monthly training calendars and/or when new training slots come up during each semester.

When considering trainers for new events, project workers will contact the trainer concerned to discuss and agree on training requirements before progressing to formal engagement.

Trainers with relevant skills and experience are invited to nominate their interest to be considered for inclusion on the eligibility list via the following process:

- Trainers nominate their interest to be on the FWT+DP Trainer Eligibility List.
- New nominees are invited to complete a trainer information sheet and supply a copy of their CV listing training experience and two (2) training related referees.
- If the nominee is considered to have skills and experience relevant to FWT+DP role and needs, they will be invited to review and respond to the FWT+DP Trainer's Orientation Package (in conversation and consultation with a FWT+DP representative).
- Successful completion of the FWT+DP Trainer's Orientation questionnaire will secure the trainers place on the eligibility list.
